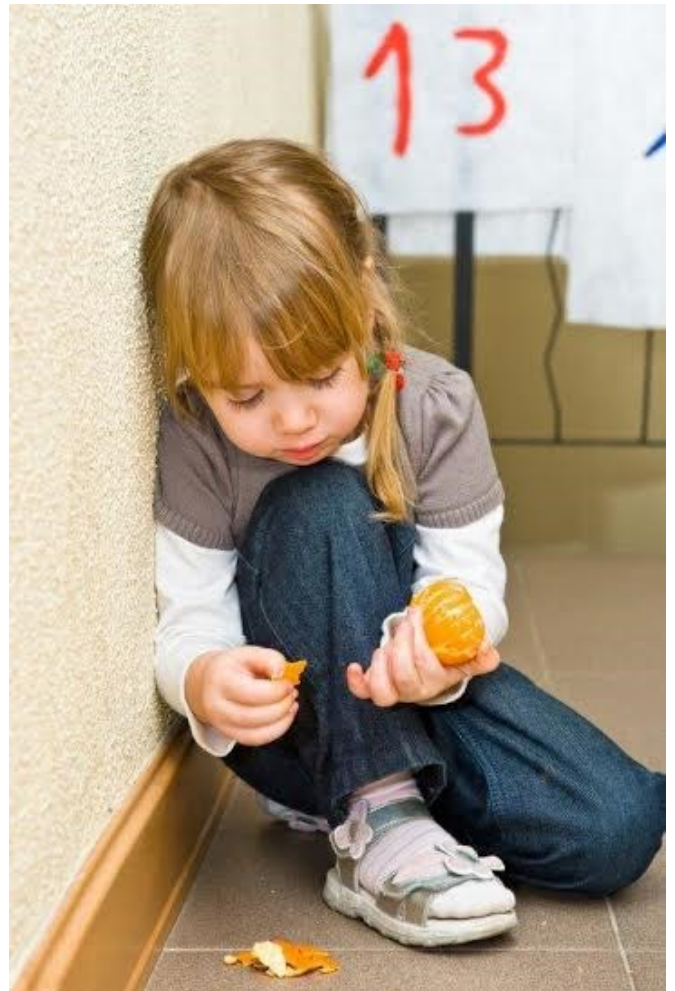

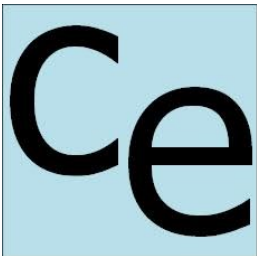


Praying about Ofsted

Ofsted inspections are stressful occasions as teaching, learning, management and every aspect of school life come under close scrutiny. Schools’ reputations and futures can be significantly influenced by the outcomes. The last couple of years have seen frequent changes both in the remit of Ofsted and also in the nature of inspections as education reforms are pushed through. The net result has been an almost total loss of confidence from the teaching profession which views the inspection regime as harmful and even, on occasion, hostile. Schools have become frightened of their own shadows. However, the most recent reforms have been cautiously welcomed as a step in the right direction.

So please pray for:

1. a willingness to continue in positive dialogue.
2. teachers, support staff, school leaders and governors as they undergo inspections to be able to demonstrate the strengths of their schools.
3. emphasis to be about genuine improvement, rather than pass or fail against a narrow set of criteria.
4. the inspection service to have wisdom and integrity and an understanding as communities where children and young people are nurtured, not just sent to pass exams .
