Racial Justice

As racial justice continues to be a pressing issue in our society, it has become increasingly important for the Keyboard Trust and Together4Bristol to contribute to promoting equality and combating discrimination.

Here are some outcomes of Keyboard Trust:

- **Increased awareness and education:** We've provided opportunities for learning about the history and present realities of racism and discrimination, both within the church and in society at large. Engaging with Catherine Okoronkwo Racial Advisor to the Bishop of Bristol. This has included hosting events to have those difficult discussions, sharing relevant books and articles, and engaging in discussions and training.
- **Advocacy and activism:** Keyboard Trust has used its influence and resources to advocate for policies and practices that promote racial justice, such as supporting Colse Leung of For Diversity - Racism and the Church, Christian Action Bristol, promoting diversity and inclusion in engaging with key leadership, and partnering with community organizations like Bristol Cathedral, National Churches Leadership Forum that work on racial justice issues.
- **Community building:** Keyboard Trust has created opportunities for building relationships and community across racial and ethnic lines. Networking with the Maclom X Centre regarding vaccination within the Black community. Being a part of the Faith Manifesto, with Christian Action Bistol. This can involve intentionally reaching out to diverse groups within the church and in the broader community, hosting events that celebrate and promote diverse cultures, and working to break down barriers and stereotypes.
- **Spiritual growth and transformation:** Finally, Keyboard Trust has created spaces for spiritual growth, prayer and transformation around racial justice. Engaged in bi-monthly prayer meetings with Bristol Mayor Marvin Rees. This has also involved grappling with racism and discrimination perpetuated within the church's framework for centuries. It has also involved seeking to live from an updated perspective and from renewed values for justice and equality in all aspects of life.

Keyboard Networker Statement

The Keyboard Trust is currently transitioning into the second phase of its mission. In the past 3 years, significant progress has been made in networking with faith leaders, individuals, and organisations across the city, as well as outside the city. Various programmes organised by Keyboard Trust have helped in educating churches and people on various platforms on different topics including the church and racial justice, mental health, and well-being to mention a few.

Regrettably, due to funding constraints, the Keyboard Networker position will end in April. However, the work of Keyboard Trust will continue under the supervision of Together4Bristol. Thank you for walking with me, encouraging me, and participating in our activities during this time.

Although I have been in the post for three years, it has also been rewarding and challenging. There is, however, a season for everything. As with any job, whether based in an office or a hybrid position, I've developed my network of support and relationships with my peers. During this time another colleague joined T4B, Ian Taylor, who was the Enabler for Mission and Unity, joined in with the work for about 1 year and has since left the organisation. There has been an increase in exposure, networking, support, and guidance during the past three years.

The steering committee is guiding the keyboard trust and role into phase three. We have established the foundation for growth, direction, and accomplishments. It is encouraging to see progress in raising church awareness of racial justice issues. We must confront these problems to solve them, and if we all do our part, we can make a difference. Over the past three years, we have organized several successful events and projects and provided helpful resources. However, there is still much to do.

The past year has had its challenges and changes; the leadership of Keyboard Trust has seen some internal changes with the baton being passed from Pastor Eric Adioo onto the newly appointed Chair Pastor Fatima Sibanda and Vice Chair Derick Mulubwa. With the Rev. Chris Dobson's departure from the steering committee.
